

Mount Pleasant Township Minutes of June 3, 2013

The Supervisors of Mount Pleasant Township held the regular monthly meeting on the above date. Chairman Fenstermacher called the meeting to order at 7pm. Those present: Supervisors Fenstermacher, Wagner, Gordner and Secretary Kindt.

MINUTES

Minutes were presented for May 2013 meeting. Supervisor Gordner made motion to approve, seconded by Supervisor Wagner. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Financials were reviewed. Supervisor Wagner made motion to approve financials, seconded by Supervisor Gordner. Motion carried.

REPORTS

Road Foreman

- 115 hours on road work including mowing, cleaning culverts and pipes, grading roads.
- 10 hours on maintenance of equipment.

Old Business

- The security system for the Community Center was again discussed. Supervisor Wagner received a quote from NorthEastern Automated Technologies, Inc. for \$2,994.95 which included several items not included in ADT, Vector or Bower quotes. (i.e. glass break alarm; door alarm on basement door). A fourth camera at the back of the Center would be an additional \$400. Monthly monitoring would be \$29.99, which is significantly lower than the others. Motion was made Supervisor Fenstermacher to contract with NorthEastern, seconded by Supervisor Gordner. Supervisor Wagner abstained. He was employed by NorthEastern in the past. Motion carried.
- Resident Sitler asked who would be responsible to replace a camera if broken. Township insurance would pay claim.
- Supervisor Wagner cleaned pipes on Johnson Road in response to resident Force's complaint.

New Business

- Resolution 76-13 was discussed regarding Prevailing Wage. Municipalities are urging PA General Assembly to "enact commonsense reforms to reduce the burden on taxpayers by increasing the threshold for compliance to reflect the increase in the Consumer Price Index". Supervisor Wagner made motion to adopt, seconded by Supervisor Gordner. Motion carried.
- Resident Geyer complained to Supervisors that her neighbor had placed "speed bumps" on her right-of-way. Supervisor Wagner explained that it is a private drive and encouraged her to contact an attorney. Zoning Office Sanders will check property to determine if any permits were needed for outbuildings.

-Resident Crawford questioned if Township has a noise ordinance. Someone is target shooting with exploding pellets. It is disturbing them and neighbors. Supervisor Wagner had received a complaint previously from a resident on Millertown Road regarding the same loud noise. Although the Township has no noise ordinance, he will ask the group to be a little more respectful of their neighbors.

There being no further business for consideration, motion was made by Supervisor Gordner, seconded by Supervisor Wagner to adjourn. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 7:16pm.
